Bone Thugs-N-Harmony to Impact Hip Hop Once Again

After auditioning over the phone for hip hop's godfather of gangsta rap, Eazy-E, in 1993; and their first album released in 1994 – Bone Thugs-N-Harmony have made their place in hip hop history.

Having a long lasting career blessed with a world wide hip hop and rap fan base, Bone Thugs-N-Harmony has worked with many of the top artists over the years; and not just artists of the hip hop genre. Artist like pop music's Phil Collins and others have shared tracks with the 'Bone Thugs'. They are also the only group that can say they have worked with the 3 late icons of hip hop and rap: Tupac Shakur (2Pac), Eazy-E and the Notorious B.I.G..

Now Bone Thugs-N-Harmony will have their impact again on hip hop with the release their long-awaited Interscope/Full Surface debut, "Strength and Loyalty," on April 17, 2007.

"I Tried," a track that features Akon is the album's lead single. Mariah Carey rejoins Bone on the melodic "Little Love," the album's second single produced by Jermaine Dupri. Another album gem is the track "Order My Steps," which pairs Bone with Grammy award winning gospel artist Yolanda Adams marking her first appearance on a hip hop album.

When asked about the new LP Layzie Bone says "Man, I just feel fortunate to be able to put together something of this quality. We"ve been working on it for some time now, and everyone involved has been focused on making a classic. I think that's what we"ve done."

When asked Wish Bone adds, "I"m really excited to be back on a major label and have the opportunity to introduce a new generation to Bone Thugs n Harmony."

This is the major-label return of the Grammy-winning super-group, now a trio (Layzie Bone, Wish Bone, and Krayzie Bone), who have been busy in the studio working with hit makers Akon, Swizz Beats, Will.I.Am, Jermaine Dupri and Neo Da Matrix.
