Rhino Records uncovers forgotten classics drawn from Atlantic's vast library and brings them together for a pair of single-disc compilations spotlighting rare recordings, Atlantic Unearthed: Soul Sisters and Atlantic Unearthed: Soul Brothers.

Both albums feature re-mastered versions of hard-to-find singles, some of which are making their CD debut; B-sides of hits and previously unreleased music by the kings and queens of soul. The albums are available now at digital and regular retail outlets and at www.rhino.com.

Atlantic Records was home to many of the legendary singers, songwriters and producers who defined the sweet sound of the early 1960s and "70s soul.

SOUL SISTERS includes 16 tracks recorded between 1964 and 1974 featuring music from Aretha Franklin, Irma Thomas, Patti LaBelle and Barbara Lewis as well as a chorus of lesser-known singers deserving of more attention such as Doris Troy, Judy Clay and Baby Washington.

Franklin opens the collection by putting her unmistakable stamp on Frank Sinatra's signature showstopper, "My Way." Originally recorded in 1970, but only released on vinyl as part of an Italian compilation, the song is making its U.S. debut. SOUL SISTERS also includes five songs previously unreleased anywhere before: Margie Joseph's cover of The Temptations" "It's Growing," their follow-up to the hit "My Girl"; Patti LaBelle & The Blue Belles" 1969 recording of "(1-2-3-4-5-6-7) Count The Days," which was originally cut by brother-and-sister duo Inez and Charlie Foxx; a cover of the Fontella Bass classic "Rescue Me" recorded in 1970 at the famed Muscle Shoals studio by Dee Dee Warwick-Dionne's sister; "Ain"t Nothing Gonna Change Me" by The Sweet Inspirations, a quartet of back-up singers who stepped out of the background in 1968 for a string of R&B hits; and "I Ain"t That Easy To Lose" by Bettye Swann, who had hit in 1967 with "Make Me Yours."

SOUL SISTERS gives often overlooked artists their due with music by Esther Phillips, who recorded "Cheater Man" for Atlantic in 1967, a funky single penned by the celebrated writing team of Chips Moman and Dan Penn. The album also features former gospel singer, Laura Lee's "What A Man," a song released by Cotillion in 1969 as a B-side of "Separation Line."

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SOUL BROTHERS presents 16 cuts recorded between 1967 and 1973 featuring music by Wilson Pickett, Otis Redding, Bobby Womack and Percy Sledge, as well as a talented group of underappreciated singers such as Arthur Conley, Percy Wiggins and James Carr.

"Can"t Stop A Man In Love," the album opener, is a previously unreleased gem by "Wicked" Wilson Pickett, the unforgettable R&B singer who died earlier this year. Recorded at Muscle Shoals in 1972, the song is one of the few remaining unreleased tracks by Pickett. SOUL BROTHERS features three more unreleased songs, including the unmistakable voice of Percy Sledge covering Aretha Franklin's hit "Baby, Baby, Baby"; "What A Woman Really Means," a song smooth-soul crooner Donny Hathaway recorded in 1973 during a session for his album Extensions Of A Man; and "Rome (Wasn"t Built In A Day)," a Sam Cooke cover recorded in 1967 by Arthur Conley, a singer discovered by fellow Georgian Otis Redding.


SOUL BROTHERS also highlights obscure but gifted singers with music by artists such as: Memphis-born Percy Wiggins, whose gorgeous first single, "Book Of Memories," was released on the Atco imprint in 1967; Ohio's Darrell Banks, who released "The Love Of My Woman" as the B-side to his lone 1968 Cotillion single, "I Wanna Go Home"; and Carl Hall, a passionate singer whose pensive, but soulful cut "Change With The Seasons" was originally released as the B-side to his Atlantic single "Need Somebody To Love."
