It was to feature prominent East Coast acts; one of the artists he intended to sign was hip-hop veteran Big Daddy Kane. Tupac (2Pac) and Kane even recorded a song before the hip-hop icon and rap legend Tupac (2Pac) was murdered. The track was entitled 'Wherever U Are'.
