Films selected for screening must contain strong hip-hop themes, characters, storylines, music, and should reflect cast and tech crew strongly associated with hip-hop. Ideal submissions will reflect the convention's themes of education, economic justice, human rights, health care, and media justice and this year's Chicago Hip-Hop Heritage Month theme of "Planet Rocking into the Future," or hip-hop getting up and out to change the world the way jazz, rock, and soul did over the past half century.
